## CHAPTER 1

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE YUKON GAME ORDINANCE."

(Assented to June 17, 1922.)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

1. Sub-section (1) of section 10 of "The Yukon Game Ordinance," as amended by Chapter 2 of the Ordinances of 1921, is hereby amended by striking out the figures "200" in the thirteenth line thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "100," and by inserting immediately after said sub-section (1) the following as sub-section (1A) thereof:

(1A) Such license shall entitle the holder thereof to kill during the open season one moose, two caribou, two deer, one mountain sheep, and one mountain goat and no more. *Provided*, That each such license holder may, under his license, during the open season, in addition to the number of animals above specified, kill one moose, two deer, two caribou, one mountain sheep and one mountain goat, provided, however, that such license holder shall, in addition to the original license fee of one hundred dollars, pay the following further or additional fees for each additional animal so killed, that is to say:

\$25.00 for each moose, caribou, deer, sheep or goat.

Such further fees shall be paid forthwith after the making of the sworn statement required to be made by such license holder under sub-section (3) hereof, to the Territorial Treasurer or his agent, who shall, upon such payment, issue and deliver to the license holder a receipt for the same, enumerating the animals for the killing of which such additional fees have been paid.

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## CHAPTER 2

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE GOVERNMENT LIQUOR ORDINANCE."

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*(Assented to June 17, 1922.)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

Sec. 22 amended.

1. Section 22 of "The Government Liquor Ordinance" is hereby amended by striking out the figures "1922" in the first line thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "1923."

2. Said Ordinance is hereby further amended by inserting therein immediately after section 29 the following as section 29a:

New Sec. 29a.

(29a) Any contravention of the provisions of this Ordinance by any servant, agent or employe shall be presumed to be the act of the employer, but such presumption may be rebutted by proof of explicit instructions to the contrary by the employer or other person charged with the offence. Any such servant, agent or employee contravening any of the provisions of this Ordinance in disobedience to any such ex-

plicit instructions, shall be liable, on summary conviction therefor, to imprisonment for not less than ten days and not more than three months without the option of a fine.

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## CHAPTER 3

### AN ORDINANCE TO CONFIRM THE DAWSON CITY ASSESSMENT ROLLS FOR THE YEARS 1920 AND 1921.

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*(Assented to June 17, 1922.)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

1. The assessment rolls for the City of Dawson for the years 1920 and 1921 respectively are hereby legalized and confirmed.

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## CHAPTER 4

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE ASSESSMENT ORDINANCE."

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*(Assented to June 17, 1922.)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

1. Sub-section (j) of section 4 of "The Assessment Ordinance," as amended by Chapter 2 of the Ordinances of 1917, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

(j) Income to the extent of \$1,000.00 of unmarried persons and widows or widowers without dependent children under the age of 18 years, and persons who are not supporting dependent brothers or sisters under that age, or a dependent parent or parents; and the income to the extent of \$2,000.00 of all other persons. Provided that in the case of married persons and widows or widowers having dependent children and of persons who are supporting dependent brothers or sisters, or a dependent parent or parents, a further amount of 200.00 for each such child, brother or sister under the age of 18 years, and each such parent, shall be so exempt.

2. Said section 4 of said Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto the following as sub-section (m) thereof:

(m) Lands and improvements and personal property belonging to "The Yukon Order of Pioneers," and occupied or used by or for the benefit of said Order.

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## CHAPTER 5

### AN ORDINANCE TO FURTHER AMEND "THE YUKON GAME ORDINANCE."

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*(Assented to June 17, 1922.)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

1. Section 4 of "The Yukon Game Ordinance," being Chapter 1 of the Ordinances of 1920, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following as sub-section (3a) of said section 4:

New sub-  
sec. (3a):

(3a) Any white fox between the fifteenth day of April and the fifteenth day of November.

## CHAPTER 6

### AN ORDINANCE TO DECLARE VALID A CERTAIN NOTICE OF SALE GIVEN UNDER "THE CROWN GRANT TAX ORDINANCE."

(Assented to June 17, 1922.)

Whereas, The first publication of the notice of sale required by section 6 of said Ordinance, as enacted by Chapter 4 of the Ordinances of 1920, given by the collector for the delinquent tax sale held under the provisions of said Ordinance on the fifth day of July, 1921, although published in the "Weekly Star," a newspaper published in the Yukon Territory nearest to the location of the land referred to in said notice, within the time required by the said Ordinance, did not contain all the particulars required by said section 6, which particulars were, however, included in the notice of sale published in three consecutive issues of said newspaper immediately following said first publication of said notice, and it is deemed expedient that the said sale be declared to have been properly held notwithstanding any omission in said first publication of the notice.

Preamble.

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, therefore enacts as follows:

Enacting clause.

1. Notwithstanding the omission from the notice of sale referred to in the preamble hereto of any particulars required by any provision of "The Crown Grant Tax Ordinance," the notice of said sale as given and published shall be deemed to have been a sufficient compliance with the said Ordinance for the purposes of said sale, and all proceedings had and things done pursuant to said notice are hereby declared to have been lawfully had and done, and to be as effectual as if the said notice of sale so published had been in compliance with the provisions of said section 6 of the Ordinance.

Notice of sale given in 1921 declared valid.

## CHAPTER 7

AN ORDINANCE FOR GRANTING TO THE COMMISSIONER CERTAIN SUMS OF MONEY TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE OF THE TERRITORY AND THE CITY OF DAWSON.

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*(Assented to June 17, 1922.)*

*Whereas*, It appears by Message from George Patton MacKenzie, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and in the Supplementary Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "A" are required to defray certain further expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory and the City of Dawson, and for the purposes relating thereto for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1922; and,

*Whereas*, It appears by Message from George Patton MacKenzie, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and the Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "B" to this Ordinance are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory, and for the purposes relating thereto for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1923; and,

*Whereas*, It appears by Message from George Patton MacKenzie, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and the Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "C" to this Ordinance are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson and for the purposes relating thereto for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1923.

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with



the advice and consent of the Council of the said Territory, therefore enacts as follows:

1. From and out of the sum at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall be paid and applied a further sum, not exceeding in the whole one hundred and four thousand eight hundred and twenty-three dollars and ninety-one cents, for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1922, as set forth in Schedule "A" to this Ordinance, and from and out of the sums at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall be paid and applied a further sum, not exceeding in the whole forty-two dollars and sixty cents, for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson for the twelve months ended March 31st, 1922, as set forth in Schedule "A" to this Ordinance.

2. From and out of the funds at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall, and may be paid and applied, a sum not exceeding on the whole two hundred and seventeen thousand and two hundred and seventy-nine dollars and seventy-two cents, for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1923, as set forth in Schedule "B" to this Ordinance.

3. From and out of the funds at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall, and may be paid and applied, a sum not exceeding thirty-eight thousand one hundred and thirty-eight dollars and ninety-three cents for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1923, as set forth in Schedule "C" to this Ordinance.

4. The due application of all monies expended shall be duly accounted for.

In the event of there being a surplus of monies standing to the credit of any item voted for Roads, Bridges and Public Works after the construction or repairs provided for have been completed to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Works and Buildings, such surplus of monies shall forthwith, on the acceptance of such work or repairs by the Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, be

taken from said item and become part of and be added to the amount provided for contingencies to such Roads, Bridges and Public Works, and shall thereafter be at the disposal of the Commissioner of the Yukon Territory for Roads, Bridges and Public Works.
