

Dear Mr. Fry,

Further to your telephone conversation with Mrs. Patricia Lortie of this Division, I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter of November 28, 1977, concerning the right-of-way for the Haines-Fairbanks Pipeline.

As the pipeline is not currently in use and because Canadian treaty obligations toward the United States are involved, immediate responsibility for future action regarding the pipeline now rests with this Department's Bureau of United States Affairs, and specifically with this Division. Since receiving a copy of your recent letter to Mr. Rutherford, we have reviewed in detail the situation regarding the Haines-Fairbanks pipeline. We have instructed the Canadian Embassy in Washington, D.C. to inform the U.S. State Department of British Columbia's interest in resolving the question of right-of-way, and to request information on U.S. intentions regarding the line. Following receipt of a reply to our inquiry, we shall consult with other interested Federal Government Departments on the future course of action to be undertaken. We will be sure to keep you informed of developments relating to the future of the pipeline, and will be in touch with you on receipt of a reply to our enquiry with U.S. authorities.
