Dear Mr. Johnson:


I have had several conversations during the last few weeks with Mr. Bob Hubbard, of Okanagan Copter Sprays. These conversations were in regards to the fifteen drums of Tordon 101 that arrived at Beaver Creek in the Yukon to be used on the spray contract issued earlier this year.

I understand from Mr. Hubbard that you actually saw the damaged goods at Beaver Creek. We are endeavouring at this time to claim on the trucking lines for the value of goods damaged. I am sure that you can understand, Mr. Johnson, that this is rather difficult to accomplish due to the fact that neither Okanagan Copter Sprays nor Dow personnel were at the site when the damage occurred. In this regard I would appreciate it very much if you could send me a letter describing the condition of the drums when you inspected the material at Beaver Creek. Your impressions of how the drums might have been damaged would also be very helpful to me.

I have guaranteed that the Dow Chemical Co. will replace those fifteen drums of damaged material so that the work can commence next year.

I look forward to your reply and if I can supply any details to you please let me know.
