Re: Proposed reservation for Champagne Indians on
Klukshu River, Y.T. Your file 8-3-803-22

I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 19th
January, 1955, enclosing two prints of the plan of survey for this
proposed Indian Reserve.

You wish to know whether it will now be in order to sell
the one-acre lot designated Lot 14 to the Mission authorities,
together with the access road also shown on the plan. There is no
objection with regard to the lot itself. However, we are somewhat
concerned about the access road. We would like to see arrangements
made which will permit the Indians the use of this road as well as
the Mission authorities. Would it be possible merely to grant an
easement to the Mission authorities over this road for use in
common with the Indians and the general public rather than make a
conveyance in fee simple.

I am pleased to note that Lot 22 as shown on this plan has
been reserved in the name of the Indian Affairs Branch, with the
exception of the Mission parcel and access road, and if arrangements
can be made to grant the Mission authorities an easement only, this
would be desirable on our part. Will you please let me know whether
this can be done.
