Re: Proposed reservation for Champagne Indians on Klukshu River, Y.T. Your file 8-0-447

This will admowledge receipt of your letter dated March 31st, 1954, concerning the survey of the area to be designated as Klukshu Indian Reserve for the Champagne Indians in the Yukon Territories.

It is agreed that provision should be made for an access road to the Homan Catholic Mission site in the area temporarily reserved, and the location would appear to be a matter of local conditions. It is noted that provision has been made so that the Indian cemetery will not be disturbed. The proposed location is therefore approved with this reservation, that our Superintendent, Mr. R. J. Meek at Whitehorse should be consulted by the Surveyor before actually settling on the location of the access road. We are sending him the sketch plan you enclosed, and if the Surveyor will confer with him, we are sure that they will be able to agree on any changes considered necessary.
