



Dear Mr. Bennett:

Your file #196317.

In reply to your letter of the 29th ult.,  
regarding the progress made on the Nahanni-Dehcho pipeline.  
I may say that the line through British Columbia is virtually  
complete. There may be some minor changes and there will  
be some additional valves installed to protect fishery streams  
but no major alteration is presently contemplated in the route  
of the pipeline as now laid.

From communications with my Department  
in Ottawa it is my understanding that the responsibility for  
the survey will be in the hands of the Surveyor General's  
Branch of the Dept. of Mines and Technical Surveys. It is  
expected that the work will be started in the summer of 1955  
but I am advised in January that my Department had not yet  
been advised if sufficient staff would be available to complete  
the work.

In view of this my I suggest that any  
further inquiry as to plans for the completion of the survey  
be directed to the Surveyor General's office at Ottawa.

You refer to the survey of the right-of-  
way of the Nahanni cut-off road, and I presume you are aware  
of the encroachment on the right-of-way of a portion of the  
site of pumping station #2 at Mile 40. When the encroachment  
was realized the matter was referred to the Dept. of National  
Defence as their agency the Northwest Highway System, has the  
responsibility for the maintenance of the road.

I have in my files copy of a letter from  
the Deputy Minister of National Defence to my own Deputy Minister

Mr. E. W. Bennett, B.C.

In which the Commissioner and the Special Commissioner, the latter  
having been appointed by the Minister of National Defence, proposed  
that the right-of-way of the highway be cleared of all encroachments  
and that the encroaching land be returned to the highway system.  
This proposal involved the services of Mr. H. G. Bennett, the  
Deputy Minister of National Defence, who in turn engaged the  
services of Mr. J. C. Thompson, the Commissioner of the Northwest  
Highway System, who in turn engaged the services of Mr. G. L. Smith,
