Dear Mr. Hopper:

I refer to my predecessor's letter of October 20 transmitting a copy of the Exchange of Notes constituting the United States-Canada Haines-Fairbanks Pipeline Agreement and his telegram of November 20 advising you that the Notes were declassified and tabled in the House of Commons Thursday, November 19.

Section 13 of the annex to United States Embassy Note No. 288 of June 30, 1953, consists of an undertaking by the United States Government to make reasonable provision for the disposition of claims and for the satisfaction of any proper claims arising out of damage or injury to persons or property occurring in Canadian territory in the course of or in connection with the construction, maintenance or operation by the United States Government of the pipeline, or of any of its associated works.

Attached for your information is a copy of a memorandum outlining the procedure suggested by the Department of External Affairs to be followed by residents of Canada in the submission of claims against United States military forces in Canada.
