1. Furnished herewith are copies of correspondence regarding permission of the Canadian Government for survey of the proposed route for the subject pipeline, which lies partly within the boundaries of Canada.

2. Note No. 277 dated 10 August 1950 from the Department of External Affairs, Canada, contains the necessary permission for the survey. It will be noted that, following the surveys, any proposal to obtain a right-of-way or construct the pipeline through Canadian territory, will require further request.

3. This office will initiate action to secure any necessary right-of-way for construction through Canada, at such time as the route to be followed is decided upon.

This will confirm our telephone conversation of August 6th in connection with a request from the Canadian Government for permission to survey a route for a pipe line from Haines, Alaska, to Fairbanks, Alaska.

It is understood that you have no objection to the required survey being carried out on that part of the route in the Province of British Columbia on the understanding that further permission will be sought before construction of a pipe line is undertaken.
