Preface to the 2nd Edition

Fort Selkirk is a meeting place for two major river systems, the Yukon and the Pelly. Located near good hunting and fishing grounds and on a flat site which was ideal for settlement, Fort Selkirk has been a gathering place for many years. A network of old trails and road beds, all meeting at Fort Selkirk, is still visible just beyond the town site. It has witnessed the meeting of cultures over generations and allows us to touch the past today.

The community of Fort Selkirk is one of the Yukon's most significant historic sites as it represents all major eras of Yukon history. During the precontact period, the area was used for fishing, camping and trading by the local Northern Tutchone and Chilkat people from the Alaskan coast. One of the first encounters between the indigenous population and the first European explorer/traders occurred here when Robert Campbell of the Hudson's Bay Company established his ill-fated trading post in the 1840s. Nearly forty years later, Arthur Harper set up another trading post and he was soon followed by Anglican missionary Reverend T. H. Canham, who established a mission nearby.

In 1898, the small post boomed to a busy settlement during the hectic days of the Klondike gold rush and Selkirk was even briefly considered as a capital for the newly-formed Yukon Territory. Selkirk was one of the few river communities to survive after the gold rush ended. In the quieter and more stable time that characterized the next fifty years, the town served as a distribution centre with an economy based on woodcutting and the fur trade. With the exception of one family, the settlement was abandoned by the early fifties when most residents moved upriver to Minto to work on the new highway to Mayo. When the section to Dawson was completed in 1955, sternwheeler traffic ceased and most of the small river communities died out.

Today at Fort Selkirk, there are some forty buildings and other structures, two cemeteries and numerous archaeological sites. Every summer a work crew of Selkirk First Nations members spends time at the townsite to stabilize and restore the buildings, maintain the campground and welcome visitors to their former home. Travellers are greeted by Maria Van Bibber, a former resident, who shares memories of the bustling river community of her youth.

From 1984 to 1988, I was a researcher for the Fort Selkirk historic site. During this time, I investigated everything from historic building materials to lands records to archival sources all over the country. As well, I had the pleasure of organizing two oral history projects at the townsite. Near the end of my time with Heritage Branch, I compiled a Fort Selkirk bibliography. This was typed up by the Heritage Branch secretary using an early, now obsolete, word processing program.

Since that time, there have been many changes in the management of the site and several additional items relating to Fort Selkirk have been either created or discovered. The Fort Selkirk Management Group was established through the *Fort Selkirk Management Plan* (1990). The site is co-managed and co-owned pursuant to the Selkirk First Nation Final Land Claim Agreement (1997). Since its inception, the Fort Selkirk Management Group has been in charge of seasonal

operations and overseen the preparation of preservation and interpretation plans for the historic site as well as a recent update to the management plan. Fort Selkirk has hosted culture camps, a number of archaeology projects, and important geological and paleontological research projects.

In August 2000, Chief Lucy McGinty of the Selkirk First Nation and Sue Edelman, Minister of Tourism, signed an update of the Fort Selkirk Management Plan at the Fort Selkirk townsite. At this gathering, Danny Roberts, the longtime “Mayor of Fort Selkirk,” was honoured for his stewardship of the site shortly before his death on August 20th.

Both the original and updated *Fort Selkirk Management Plan* recommended that as an important step in further research of the site, the 1988 bibliography be updated. This has been my task over the past few months. The new bibliography is much more detailed, includes sources found through Internet searches, and has grown from 31 to over 80 pages. A limited amount of additional research was conducted through web searches and Yukon Archives records. Since it is now in a digital format, the document can easily be added to at regular intervals.

This document has been enriched by the contributions of Pelly Crossing elders, other former Fort Selkirk residents and Fort Selkirk work crew members. They donated some of the photograph collections listed in this bibliography and identified people, places and time periods in many of the images. Many thanks to Kathy Alfred at Pelly Crossing who took time from yet another busy day to steer me through the records of the Selkirk First Nation library. At Heritage Branch, I am indebted to Ruth Gotthardt in the Archaeology section, Bruce Barrett at Historic Sites, and John Storer in Paleontology for assistance in identifying relevant government records. Finally, my appreciation to Bruce Barrett and Doug Olynyk at Heritage Branch who oversaw the project, and the Fort Selkirk Management Group for giving me the opportunity to do this interesting work.
