Dear Mr. Stephens:

The Federal Committee on Pest Control has reviewed the proposal submitted by you on February 11, 1969, involving aerial application of herbicides for brush control along the Haines-Fairbanks POL pipeline.

The Committee did not object to the use of Picloram and 2,4-D with the Norbak thickener, in view of unsatisfactory results from 2,4-D and 2,4,5-T on spruce on the right-of-way. We noted also that the spraying would be limited to within 100 feet of streams, lakes or other bodies of water and would not be conducted if the wind were stronger than 5 miles per hour.
