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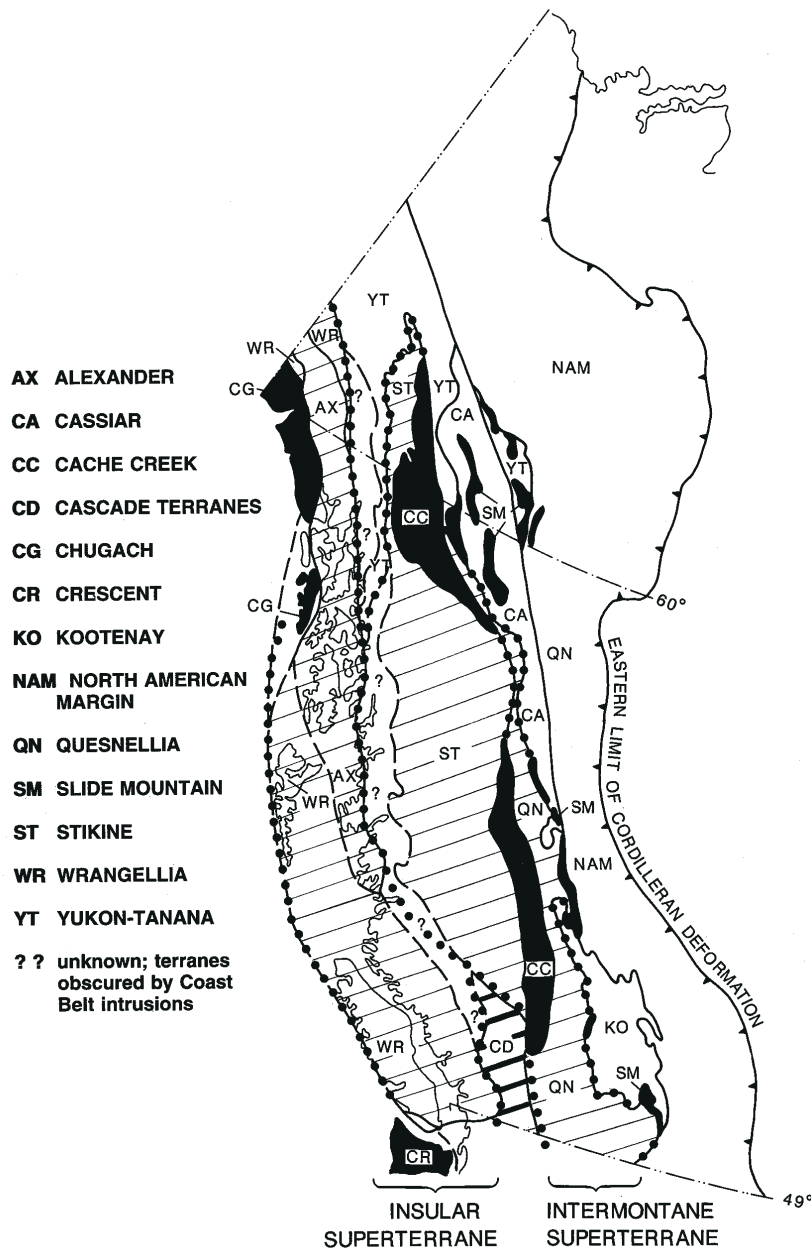

Simplified terrane map of the Canadian Cordillera; summary descriptions of terranes in and near Coast Mountains are summarized in **Table 1**; others in Gabrielse et al., 1991. Pericratonic terranes (CA, KO, NAM, YT) that formed along the margin of the craton have no ornamentation; accreted terranes include (1) magmatic arc terranes (AX, QN, ST, WR) shown hachured; (2) oceanic terranes (CC, CR, SM) incorporated as subduction complexes shown in black; CD (Cascade terranes) shown as a mixture of oceanic and arc terranes (see **Figure 6** for detail). Heavy dots delineate Intermontane, Insular superterrane boundaries.
