PREFACE

This Volume is one of four containing different elements of an inventory of Canada's capabilities to undertake "sustainable cities initiatives" in urban regions around the globe. Its initial preparation in March-April of 1998 was funded by the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade, with logistical and other support by the National Round Table on the Environment and the Economy (NRTEE). In the summer of 1998, NRTEE decided to fund a process of updating and expanding the first version. This work was carried out over the period August-October, with excellent cooperation from organizations and private sector companies across Canada.

The Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade has sustainable development as one of its key objectives. Throughout the 1990s, the Department has been active in promoting Canada's positions on such urban-related issues as global climate change, marine pollution, peacebuilding and reconstruction, and development of civil society. In addition, the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) has been investing in a growing number of urban projects, and took a leading role in developing the Canadian position for HABITAT II, the second United Nations Conference on Human Settlements, held in 1996.

The National Round Table is one of four advisory bodies to the Prime Minister of Canada. In 1995 and 1996, it hosted a series of round table reviews of domestic environmental infrastructure, with emphasis on water and wastewater services in Canada. This resulted in a major report on the "state of the debate" in this field.

Over the year 1997, the National Round Table gave even more focused attention to the subject of sustainable cities, with more of an international focus. For example, in May, it hosted an international workshop *Toward Sustainable Cities in APEC: Urban Air Quality and Urban Energy Management*, to provide recommendations to the Canadian government.

The Round Table also co-Chaired the Business Leaders and Local Authorities Forum of the APEC Environment Ministerial, and commissioned an inventory of Canadian sustainable cities expertise, used as one of the base documents for this report. Finally, the chair of the Round Table Foreign Policy Committee presented information at the Beijing meeting *Environmental and Economic Policies Toward Sustainable Cities in APEC*.

At the end of January, 1998, the Round Table hosted a workshop on "Sustainable Cities Solutions" in Ottawa, bringing together some 50 experts from industry, government, non-governmental organizations, and centres of expertise across Canada. This "mapping" project was one of the principal recommendations arising from the workshop. The need for it was reenforced at additional round table sessions of stakeholders on urban project finance and risk management, held in May and in August of 1998.

The following people contributed actively and effectively to preparing this volume, and the larger report of which it is a part: Michael Harcourt, Chair, Foreign Policy Committee, NRTEE; Brian Morrisey, Director General, Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade (DFAIT); David Morgan, Policy Advisor, NRTEE; Peter Paproski and Isabel Hentic, Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA); Lucien Bradet, Director General, Environmental Affairs Branch and Prue Thomson, Environmental Affairs Branch, Industry Canada.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Purpose and Scope of This Volume

In urban regions around the world, there are huge opportunities for Canadians to work with municipalities and provincial/state authorities, as well as with non-governmental and private sector organizations to build a more sustainable future. Forming successful partnerships with and marketing solutions to these people requires both specialized knowledge and integrated solutions. In the vast majority of cases, they will want proposals that include financing, capacity-building, technology transfer and local employment as well as new technologies and products.

Building on previous work of the National Round Table on the Environment and the Economy, this volume signals, organization by organization, Canadian involvement in programs and projects leading to more sustainable development in urban regions around the globe. It offers a reasonably accurate and comprehensive picture of current Canadian urban capabilities and commitments as of October, 1998.

In more specific terms, this volume covers participation by Canadian non-governmental organizations, university-based experts, government agencies, and others in specific cities and regions in:

- helping to plan cities and urban regions so as to increase their environmental, economic, social and political sustainability;
- helping to plan and implement urban-scale infrastructure, facility, and building projects to reduce energy, materials, natural resource consumption, and damage to health and habitats;
- helping to increase the capacity of local governments for environmental management through advisory services, training, technology transfer, institutional strengthening projects and other means.

The aim of this volume is to increase the potential for more coordinated efforts to achieve international development objectives efficiently and effectively abroad, and thus to increase environmental and social sustainability in affected cities.

Included in Volume II are baseline data and project information on:

- Canadian centres of urban expertise, whether in universities and colleges, in independent research institutes, or in non-governmental organizations;

- Canadian organizations involved in urban project delivery, often within a much wider international development mandate;
- Canadian professional and trade associations concerned with urban development issues either as one among many topics, or perhaps as a focus of primarily domestic attention;
- Canadian government departments and agencies engaged in urban-related activities within Canada, or in attending to Canadian interests abroad.

1.2 Contents of Other Volumes

Volume I contains a comprehensive analysis of the whole information base on Canadian capabilities to undertake sustainable cities projects on a global basis.

In Volume III are companies such as consulting engineering firms, urban planners, builders and others who can implement projects in cities and urban regions, whether in other countries or in Canada itself. The emphasis is on those which have direct experience in exporting products, technologies and services to developing and transitional economies.

Volume IV contains information on Canadian involvement in different urban regions around the world, organized by sector and discipline. It seeks to identify the nature and amounts of current Canadian technical assistance and development-oriented investment. The Volume also covers current integrated urban initiatives, by urban region or regions of focus. It identifies many urban investment projects of International Financial Institutions. Finally, Volume IV also contains information on international organizations active in urban development-related issues, a number of which, like the International Council on Local Environmental Initiatives (ICLEI), are based in Canada itself.

1.3 Methods Employed to Collect Information

The Bayswater project team first considered organizational information already in hand. This had previously been collected for DFAIT, NRTEE, Environment Canada, the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation and others involved in the sustainable cities issue over the period 1997-98, especially in connection with Canada's International Year of Asia Pacific. Then the consultants undertook a three-step process in gathering, organizing, and checking information for additional profiles:

- searching comprehensive information and data bases at CIDA and at the International Development Research Centre (IDRC);

- contacting governmental, non-governmental and industry association networks, nationally, and in each of Canada's five major regions, including the Federation of Canadian Municipalities, provincial government sources, and key university-based institutes and consortiums;
- checking with individual research institutes, municipal governments, and locally-based non-governmental organizations as required.

Individual researchers were employed in Vancouver, Winnipeg, Montreal and Halifax to collect and to confirm information about current activities of educational institutions and research centres. The aim of the work as a whole was to fill out tables set out in Annexes "A" through "D", which contain English and French profiles, according to the language in primary use at each organization.

1.4 Limitations of the Volume

All profiles contained in this volume were sent by mail in August and September for review by the individual organizations or government agencies involved. Corrections received by fax, telephone, or e-mail as of the end of the business day on Friday, October 16, 1998 have been included.

In any information collection process, it is inevitable that there will be errors and omissions. The scope of what is to be included from a given organization, or how it is to be presented is not always clear. While the Bayswater mapping team contacted many different organizations, some that are highly relevant may simply have eluded those undertaking scanning work. As well, the nature and scope of activities undertaken by different organizations is in a constant process of flux.

2. CANADA'S CENTRES OF URBAN EXPERTISE

"Centres of urban expertise" exist across Canada. They typically combine social science, engineering or other research on issues and problems of urbanizing regions with practical experience in cities of developing countries and emerging economies. Such centres include: university or college departments focused on planning, geography and/or the environment; specialized research and training institutes; and certain non-governmental organizations (NGOs) that focus mainly on urban issues abroad.

3. NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS INVOLVED IN URBAN PROJECT DELIVERY

Canada has many non-governmental organizations which do not specialize in urban development as such, but which do undertake urban-focused projects within a wider portfolio of international development projects, usually in rural communities. Non-governmental organizations encompass a wide array of locations in Canada and of interests abroad. Some examples are: Alternatives of Montreal, CARE Canada, Carrefour de solidarité international de Sherbrooke, Jeunesse Canada Monde, and World Vision Canada.

4. KEY INDUSTRY, MUNICIPAL AND PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

Most industry and professional organizations act mainly as representatives of domestic concerns of their members and as networking bodies. However, quite a number are also engaged in international projects. Many have members active in projects around the world, and accordingly promote the interests of their members at trade shows and in missions, and encourage them to develop greater international experience. Some are specifically geared to environmental industries, while others represent products and services such as residential construction and urban design that have major environmental quality dimensions. Among the organizations profiled are the Canadian Institute of Planners, the Royal Architectural Institute of Canada (RAIC) and the Transportation Association of Canada (TAC).

Also included in this annex are municipally-based agencies such as Montreal International and Toronto International Partnership. International programming at the municipal level also exists in cities like Edmonton, Halifax, Moncton, and Ottawa.

5. GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS WITH RELATED MANDATES AND SERVICES

The database profiles 15 Federal government organizations with mandates and services relevant to international development and to exports of Canadian urban products, technologies and services.

In some cases, like Human Resources Development Canada and Transport Canada, there are very active efforts to market the department's own expertise and services abroad.

The Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, the Canadian Commercial Corporation, the Export Development Corporation, Industry Canada and Western Economic Diversification Canada focus on assisting the Canadian private sector in developing export experience.

Key agencies explicitly supporting sustainable cities initiatives are the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA), Environment Canada, DFAIT, the International Development Research Centre (IDRC), NRTEE, the National Research Council of Canada and Natural Resources Canada.
