I went in to the freedgold mountain country early in the spring before the ice was out of the creek in order to get my trailer in. I had to hire a D7 cat to move the ice out of the crossing. I used a bombadire to pull my trailer up the mountain to a good spot to camp. This episode takes about a week + shortly after that a flood takes place an act of mother nature it washed the road out so I had to come over top of the mountain to get the remainder of my gear in D7 again. But I finally got everything I needed in for awhile. Where I wanted to dig I had to go up creek + change the water course so it wouldn't keep my hole full all the time. I started a hole where I thought the old channel had been I dug sunk steam points cut wood pumped the hole out + dug. I took a sample every 2 feet which turned out not too bad as when I panned I couldn't see anything blind I guess. Then along in the middle of the summer along comes another flood overnight it filled my hole took my pump + generator gold pan shovel pick even my rubber gloves.

now I have a map her I marked my holes 1, 2 & 3, No. one hole went down 14 feet in frozen dirt had to dig it twice & wind it out on a windlass up & down the ladder fill the bucket & wind it out.

Now the second hole wasn't quite so bad it was up the small creek farther I didn't have to move the windlass up there approx 7 ft. deep but it was still frozen earth which don't move easy.

Number 3 was up in a canyon two thousand feet after the flood was over it moved a quite a bit of gravel so I moved the creek over to one side & dug another hole I'm looking for nuggets there is fine gold there too no nuggets.

Now all in all I know there is gold there but it's too hard a work to do it by hand so next year I need a backhoe (Conclusions)
