- W.G.2 Willfordon canyon seen here in **75** spring and fall moving through in the 1930's and 1940's. (He trapped here in winter)
- E.W. Ed Whitehouse - winter **58** early 1940's
- A.R.3 Ardie Rutak winter 1936-37 **57**
- 64** W.L. Laska winter 1940-41
- Olsen 1957 "Canyon was observed below the Teton Range in the 1930's although out-train drivers and local pilots said canyon was scattered through country in late winter, spring '60"
- Olsen 1957 "March 8 1957. Canyon scattered in small bands all through the hills on both sides of Yukon and Teton. This is the first time in 14 years that large nos of caribou have wintered in this area" according to Rudy Burton, stockkeeper at Stewart Ar.
- G.P. Gordon Cameron - **70** major river crossings by canyon in July, continued into Dawson Range.
- H.B.2 July movements **66-69**
- Bostock, northeast extension of zone of trails **74**
- Bostock 74:80 "In the 1930's caribou were scattered in bands of 10 to 200 in winter over the region of which the Dawson Range formed the backbone!"
DE DIX MILLE METRES
- Robert Forsild (in Klaskan, Jack 1950:17) "Forsild shot caribou near the mouth of the Sixty Mile about 1930 that were migrating"
- Jack Edgar (in Klaskan, Jack 1950:17) "Jack Edgar who was mining on Ten Mile Creek in 1936, claimed to have seen caribou on the hills near that location a few years prior to that summer."
- Stacy's notes "Canyon wintered in the Louisa River, Sixty mile River region, including 40 mile 1952-53 winter 1953-54 1960 1908 in this area. Anniversary Nov 17 1908"
- Callison "Canyon came into the 60 mile river beginning in early October. From there they crossed the Yukon and spread out over the hills between the Stewart River and 12 mile River." 1956
- Henning "The dist. + movement patterns of caribou in Alaska (Fig. 8) are..."
- Henning Oct 25 1970 "Old trails leading in cascade."
- Mune 1935:71 "fall crossings of canyon just below mouth of White River, at mouth of Stewart River at Besford Creek, A.G.C. Creek (below Besford)..."
- Anner, 1966p.30 "In 1944 a large winter herd was seen, formed a band 1 1/2 x 1 1/4 miles!"
- Bostock 1979:80 "Their tracks were most common, widest at most deeply worn along a zone ... between the mouths of the White and Stewart Rivers pointing towards the headwaters of Sixty Mile River. Tracks as far as the northwest as from the creek in Stewart as a general line ... in the Klondike and to Dawson Range."
- Zelich Smith **62** "In late 30's fall best trapped hole caribou cross Dawson Range at Stewart."
- Mune 1955:71 "It was reported that caribou wintered in the vicinity of the mouth of White River."
- McBeth Klondike News 7/1962 "Ed McBeth, in 1943's camp on Besford Creek, a tributary of the Stewart, in tracks he had seen a mass of caribou in plentiful game"
