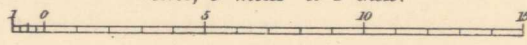


MAP of ATLIN GOLD FIELDS

Scale, 6 miles to 1 inch.



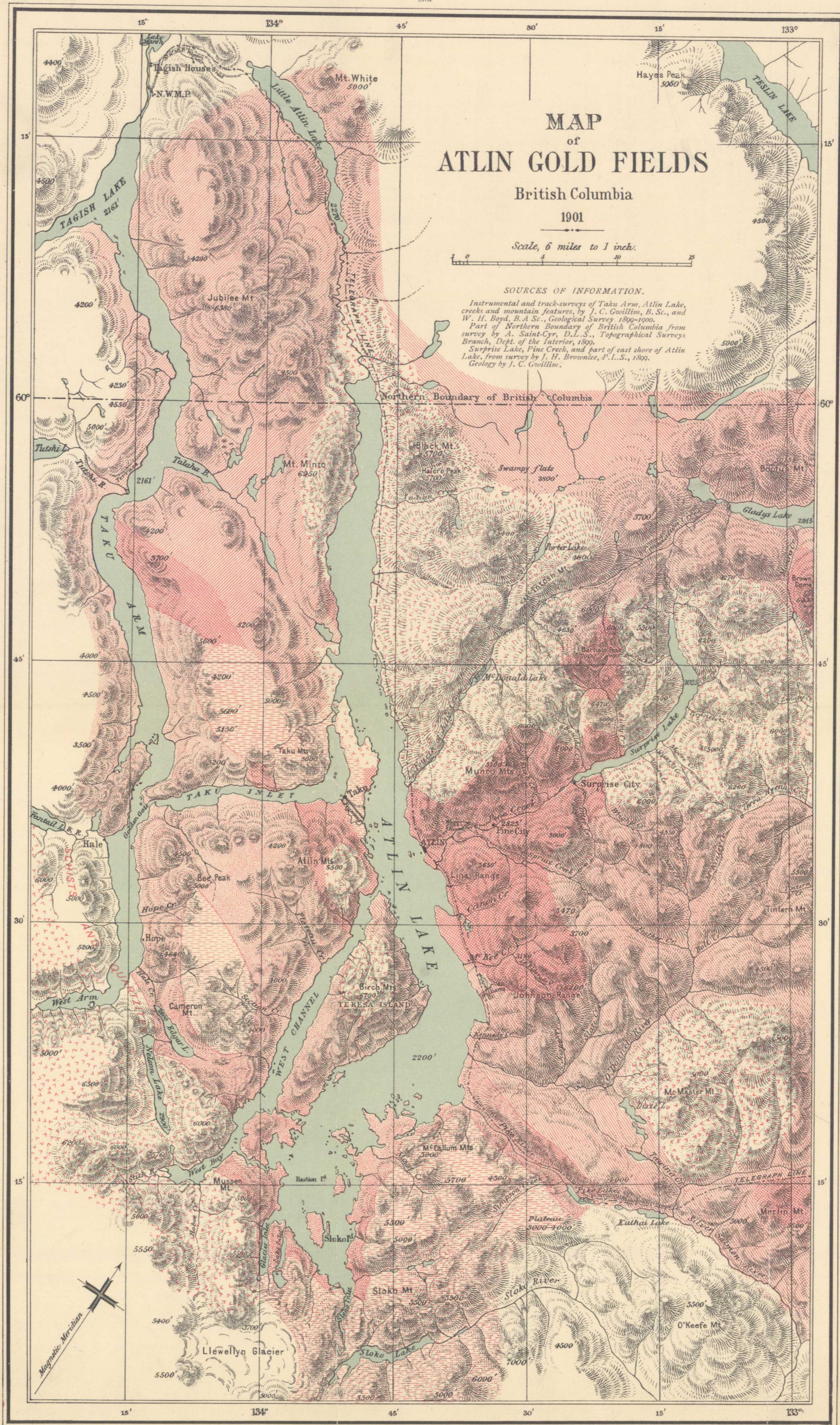

Geological Indications.

- Cretaceous
Sandstones, argillites, etc.
- Greenstones, serpentines, "slates"
(Gold-bearing rocks)
- Quartzites, slates, etc.
- Limestones
Probably Carboniferous
- Basalts, porphyries etc.
- Granitic rocks
