PROSPECTING SUMMARY

SEPTEMBER  
10/92

My first prospecting trip was to south canal stream at the Fox creek and timber creek area.

We spent some time there collecting samples. We came back (Sam & I) with some pretty high grade ore.

Then we approach the Ross River band for staking on their land. We talked to the Chief and councilors. They said they were going to send us a letter regarding to this matter.

Now that they have another Chief, I'll try again to ask if we can stake.

Cost incurred: Supplies - \$400.00  
Vehicle / Groceries expenses - \$600.00

Next we went to Bennett lake where we also took some samples the only problem we had here was the lake was always pretty rough at times we had to wait until early hrs. till the wind had slowed down.

Then we also went down the Carcross lake, took more samples down lower end of lake. We were on foot for some times, somewhere around the area were located some good silver & lead occurrences.

Also at Lake Benette we have found some of these occurrences.

Around the dry creek area we had no such luck as most of the creeks were high and there was a lot of run off. We then panned our way back down towards Whitehorse stopping and camping at creeks such as Sand Rite, Half Creek, Brooks, Brocks Creek. Then around the Steam boat and Lake Kusma where we did some panning & some chipping for Rock analyzing.

Then our next destination is Blangard River where we also spent quite some time rough country with a lot of Willows. Here we had to move our camps also several times around took some samples. Came back to Whitehorse for more supplies then came back here to Blangard River. This is about a mile and half this side of the B. C. Border. Again we spent more time trying to get some better samples. But it doesn't show very much sign of anything worthwhile. I could see that other prospectors were around this area also.

Some sign of where prospectors were digging, old cabins, and chippings around. Also down around & across the Dalton post area. We only drove so far on this road because it gets pretty steep and the roads are so narrow and the rain just makes it worst. We did some panning and Chipping racks also in the area.

The McHenry & Ruby Range Mountains Did not show us any real good potentials that we could actually said were done anything real well, in this area. We mostly did a lot of panning, moving around quite a lot. We've found only some little traces of ~~of~~ some little gold specks. Also this is ~~a~~ someone working down in this area for gold.

I know this person but can't remember to put it down in writing. We also went to the Klee Lake area where we also did some chipping, good panning also with little luck. When we got back to the main camp stayed for a day. Then again we went back to Whitmore, and off again.

to Blongard River. When we again started of in a different direction to prospect, I don't know what's with this place that I keep coming back. Maybe just a hunch.

Well we got some early snow this year and it's mighty chilly up here where we're at.

Next year I would like to try again, with better luck.

But I think Lake Bennett and the lower lake of Carcross area is my main target for next year. But if I can convince Koss River First Nation to compromise maybe things could work out even better.
