

Recommended Peel Watershed Regional Land Use Plan: Errata Release #1 (January 5th, 2010)

Errata listed in this document relate to the Peel Watershed Regional Land Use Plan released on December 2nd, 2009.

Erratum 1:

On page 4-2-11 (recommendations for LMU B: Blackstone River Uplands), the incorrect checkbox next to “Existing industrial surface or sub-surface activities” was checked. The checkbox under “Allowable” should have been checked.

Comment: this erratum corrects inconsistencies with Key Recommendation E on page v, and with section 3.3.1 on page 3-8.

Erratum 2:

On page 4-2-30 (recommendations for LMU E: Snake River), the incorrect checkbox next to “Existing industrial surface or sub-surface activities” was checked. The checkbox under “Allowable” should have been checked.

Comment: this erratum corrects inconsistencies with Key Recommendation E on page v, and with section 3.3.1 on page 3-8.

Erratum 3:

On page 4-2-72 (recommendations for LMU M: Turner Lake Wetlands), the incorrect checkbox next to “Existing industrial surface or sub-surface activities” was checked. The checkbox under “Allowable” should have been checked.

Comment: this erratum corrects inconsistencies with Key Recommendation E on page v, and with section 3.3.1 on page 3-8.

Erratum 4:

On page 4-2-84 (recommendations for LMU O: Teetł'it njik / Lower Peel River), two checkboxes next to “Existing industrial surface or sub-surface activities” were checked. Only the checkbox under “Not Applicable” should have been checked.

Comment: this erratum corrects inconsistencies with Table D.2 in Appendix D.

Erratum 5:

On page 3-11 (Section 3.3.1 Lands in Special Management Areas: General Environmental Protection Emphasis), the text:

The Plan recommends the withdrawal of subsurface and associated surface rights in these zones. Such withdrawal provides the maximum legal authority to protect natural resources of very high ecological and heritage/cultural value. The Plan allows existing surface tenures (e.g., camps, cabins, and buildings) in the LMU sub-unit.

Should be replaced with:

The Plan recommends that these zones be withdrawn from the establishment of new tenures (e.g., mineral claims, oil and gas exploration permits, lodges, big-game outfitting base camps) in order better to protect natural resources of very high ecological and heritage/cultural value. The Plan allows existing tenures in these zones, subject to specific management conditions.

Comment: this erratum corrects inconsistencies with Key Recommendation E on page v, and with section 3.3.1 on page 3-8.
